- Listening to can be difficult and it we need to work hard to do this.





How can you support your son/daughter in GCSE English?



In school:

Students have 5 hours of English per week:

- 2 hours of English Language (on Wednesdays): students perfect key skills (language and structure analysis, evaluation of authors choices, comparing, imaginative and non fiction writing)
- 3 hours of English Literature text study: plot, characterisation, author's craft, themes and context.
- 1-1.5h homework a week:
- Reading and annotating in depth
- Writing essay responses
- Retrieval practice on Carousel / online quizzes



At home: independent work

- → Re-read and add to annotations of a studied text
- → Read around the text to become an expert: British library, BBC Bitesize, Podcasts , etc...
- → Practising past papers questions (planning and/or writing responses)



At home: Organising your study notes


- Paper 1, section A Unseen 19th Century reading

How can you help your child in year 10?

- Provide a quiet space for studying
- Help organising the study notes (folder with dividers to keep notes organise)
- Encourage to re-read / add to annotations, read around the texts to deepen the knowledge of the text / context
- Check their texts for annotations

How can you support your child in GCSE Mathematics?

Mathematics at Key Stage 4

- GCSE Maths is a two-year course studied in year 10 and 11.
- GCSE Maths is assessed at Foundation Tier (grades 1-5) OR Higher Tier (grades 4-9).
- All question papers must be taken at the **same tier**.
- Students are examined in all aspects of maths including number, algebra, geometry and statistics, with a focus on problem solving.
- The **final exam** consists of the following papers:
- Paper 1: Non-Calculator (1.5 hours, 80 marks)
- Paper 2: Calculator (1.5
- Paper 3: Calculator

(1.5 hours, 80 marks)

- ulator (1.5 hours, 80 marks)
- All content could be assessed on any of the papers.

Mathematics at Key Stage 4


- Students will have **4 lessons** per week.
- Students will have a homework task once a week. This will normally be set on Dr Frost Maths.
- At the end of each half-term, there will be an assessment to take. This will
 assess the learning throughout the term and a question level analysis (QLA)
 will highlight areas that students will need to improve in.
- At the end of January 2025, a small number of **able students** will be chosen to study for the **Level 3 Algebra awards**. The exam will be sat in **January 2026** and the qualification will give students **UCAS points** towards University application. But more importantly this course will prepare students to achieve the top **GCSE grades** in Maths as well as further studies in Maths.

How you can support your child


- A quiet space to work and a regular routine for completing homework are highly recommended.



Useful Resources

4.1.1.5 Microscopy

Content

Students should be able to:

- understand how microscopy techniques have developed over time
- explain how electron microscopy has increased understanding of sub-cellular structures.

Limited to the differences in magnification and resolution.

An electron microscope has much higher magnification and resolving power than a light microscope. This means that it can be used to study cells in much finer detail. This has enabled biologists to see and understand many more sub-cellular structures.




