Y9 Trip RAF Museum

On Wednesday our Year 9 students Visited the RAF Museum in Hendon. The students were engaged, respectful, and demonstrated a genuine interest in the aircraft exhibits. A standout attraction was the in-depth presentation on the invaluable contributions of Afro-Caribbean and African pilots during World War I and II. Learning about different ethnic groups' involvement in major historical events fosters a greater appreciation for diversity and unity - a lesson fundamental to students' personal development and cultural understanding. There was also an important recognition, in the exhibits, of the integral role played by the brave Polish pilots who flew British warplanes during World War Two. Faith – Sunday of The Fathers of The First Ecumenical Council


The seventh Sunday after the Feast of Holy Pascha is observed by the Orthodox Church as the Sunday of the Fathers of the Fire Ecumenical Council. This day commemorates the 318 God-bearing Fathers who gathered in Nicaea in AD 325 at the request of the Emperor, Saint Constantine the Great, to address the heresy of Arianism and the unity of the Church.

Arius was a protopresbyter of the Church of Alexandria, who blasphemed against the Son of God saying that He was not the true God, consubstantial with the Father, but rather a work or creation of God. Despite being expelled from the Church of Alexandria in AD 321, Arius' continued with his controversial and divisive heretical teachings, which led to a theological and ecclesiastical crisis throughout the Christian Church.

Moved with divine zeal and concern for unity, the Emperor Constantine the Great summoned the First Ecumenical Council in Nicaea, a city of Bithynia. Here the bishops of the Church gathered in AD 325. All of them, with one voice, declared that the Son and Word of God is one in essence with the Father, true God of true God. The Fathers composed the holy symbol of Faith the Nicene Creed (in Greek on the icon above):

"We believe in one God. The Father Almighty. Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the only begotten, begotten of the Father before all ages. Light of Light; true God of true God; begotten not made; of one essence with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became man. And He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered, and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again with glory to judge the living and the dead; whose Kingdom shall have no end."

The Fathers also anathematized Arius for his heretical beliefs and teachings, cutting him off from the Church





Vaccination is the safest and most effective way to protect against measles. Two doses of the MMR vaccine offers long term protection. Children who get measles can become very ill. Some will suffer life changing complications.

To stop the spread and reduce serious illness, make sure your child is up to date with their MMR (measles, mumps & rubella) vaccinations.

If your child missed the MMR vaccine in school, they can get it at a catch-up clinic or by making an appointment with their GP. All routine childhood vaccines are free. **Catch-up clinics:**


Who are Springpod?
