





Year 10 Students Engage in Loci Lesson

Year 10 students recently experienced a dynamic and engaging mathematics lesson that took them out of the classroom and into the playground. Equipped with chalk, string, and straight edges, the students explored the concept of loci in a hands-on activity that made abstract geometry come alive.

Loci, a fundamental concept in geometry, involves the set of points that satisfy certain conditions. To help students grasp this concept, the lesson began with a brief explanation before moving outside. Once in the playground, students were divided into small groups, each provided with the necessary tools to visualise different loci scenarios.



This outdoor activity not only made learning enjoyable but also promoted teamwork and critical thinking. The physical space allowed students to step into the loci they created, enhancing spatial awareness and making the abstract concepts more concrete.

By the end of the lesson, students had a solid grasp of loci and could explain the concepts confidently. This innovative approach demonstrated the effectiveness of experiential learning, highlighting the benefits of taking lessons beyond the traditional classroom to engage and inspire students.
