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Year 12 Biology

Year 12 Biologists got the chance to attend talks by leading doctors, journalists and scientists including Nessa Carey who is the author of the book we are currently reading in lesson (Junk DNA).


The talks covered a range of topics like how we can improve human hearing using chicken DNA, epigenetics, the impact of climate change on arctic ecosystems, what happens to your body at high altitudes and how surgical methods have improved using robotics to remove oesophageal cancer where we got to watch clips of the surgery.

A common theme across all the talks was the importance of building your transferrable soft skills and the use of AI in analysing data sets and how it has helped scientists to predict outcomes.

It was interesting to hear the career paths of the scientists in that they didn't always end up specialising in what they initially thought they would. One example is Mark Brandon who started off as a physicist and now works as a Polar Oceanographer filming with David Attenborough for documentaries like Blue Planet and analysing data in the arctic regions, with a focus on the biological impact but using physics to explain the length of day at the poles due to the Earth's tilt.

Sparx Reader is an online reading platform allowing students to regularly read books for pleasure. Everyday reading is not only a relaxing activity, but also allows students to expand their ideas, vocabulary and improve understanding of any text they will face in exams or as adults.

Sparx Reader offers students a choice of books at their reading level, as well as ensuring they read books with understanding by completing check-in questions along the way. The platform is used for KS3 English weekly homework; students need to achieve minimum 300 points each week (this equates to approximately 30 min of careful reading).

We are very pleased that many of our students exceed this target every week, with some top scorers achieving well above a thousand points a week. Since the launch of Sparx Reader a month ago, our KS3 students have completed amazing 3394 hours of careful reading and read altogether 1 books so far. Truly well done!





Update BACE Spring 2025 and Positive Activities Holidays

We are fast approaching this coming Spring Term Holiday (Easter) by which **BACE** will be providing camps across the borough with **funded spaces** for those on **benefit related FSM (pupil premium)**. Please note several of the BACE providers are now Ofsted registered, and advertising paid spaces for those who do not qualify for funded spaces. Parents who claim universal tax credits may be able to claim back some of the costs of these camps, when booking one of the advertised Ofsted registered providers.

Booking for the funded spaces, must be made via <u>Barnet Youth – Child and Family Early Help Service - BACE Holidays - BACE Holidays</u> Any spaces book via the providers own website will be charged as advertised. Parent's must provide their child's 16-digit e-voucher code, to ensure their child's booking is secure. Any bookings without 16-digit vouchers, are subject to being cancelled by the administrative team.

16-digit voucher codes will be issued via schools, as per the school pupil premium list as normal. Please note, schools can refer a further 15% of non-free school meal children who are vulnerable. This would include those who do not have recourse to public funds, looked after children, parents experiencing emotional trauma and hardship. Please refer those who do not fall into these categories and in receipt of universal credits to a paid space. Note: you can refer 1 child for every 10-benefit related FSM school.

We also are delivering the Positive Activities Holiday programme **eligible for all children living or attending school** in the London Borough of Barnet. Positive Activities will provide a series activities over the 2 weeks holiday. (Lunch is not provided). The activities must be booked via <u>Barnet Youth – Child and Family Early Help Service - Positive Activities - Positive Activities</u>.

The 16-digit e-voucher codes, and bookings and the BarnetYouth E-Magazine, go live on Friday 7 March 2025, published booklets will follow.

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




