Alex, in sensational form, netted two more goals, completing his four-goal haul and securing a 4-2 advantage. Although Ashmole pulled a goal back, the defence, bolstered by Dinari, Armelo and Loughran's steadfast performances, held firm through a nervy conclusion. This victory propels STA into the borough final, with hopes high for their first trophy win as a year group.

Byzantine Choir

As part of our lead up to Easter and our ongoing commitment to faith and ethos, the St Andrew Byzantine Choir recently visited St Katherine's Greek Orthodox Church to take part in a special school church service. This visit formed part of our school's wider programme of spiritual and cultural engagement through music.

During the service, our choir performed selections from the Lamentations, or Engomia, which are a series of deeply moving hymns traditionally sung on Good Friday during the Orthodox Matins of Holy Saturday. These poetic verses, chanted in Ancient Greek, mourn the death of Christ while also pointing towards the hope of the Resurrection. Although usually reserved for Holy Week, our students had the rare opportunity to explore and share this powerful tradition in advance, as part of our educational and spiritual preparation for Easter.

The priest and congregation were visibly moved by the performance. In particular, the priest commented on the exceptional clarity and accuracy of the choir's Ancient Greek pronunciation, which is no small achievement given the linguistic and musical complexity of the hymns.

Father Damien was so impressed that he extended a warm invitation to our choir to join the church's own choir during the actual Paschal Easter services. This was a great honour and a testament to the respect and admiration our students earned through their preparation, musical skill, and reverence.

At St Andrew, we believe in nurturing the spiritual life of our students through meaningful, real-world experiences. This visit exemplified the powerful connection between faith, music, and cultural heritage, and we are proud of the role our choir continues to play in strengthening those values.

This creative way of keeping track of the Lenten season helped people stay mindful of their journey toward Easter Sunday.

In class, we designed our own *Miss Lent* in our books, using our imagination to create different versions of this historical figure. Some of us drew traditional designs, while others gave *Miss Lent* a modern twist! It was a fun and creative way to connect with an old tradition while deepening our understanding of Lent.

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Year 9 Scientists Explore Archimedes' Principle


Year 9 Science students recently participated in a hands-on experiment to determine the volume of irregular objects, such as rocks, using a Eureka can. By observing the displacement of water, students calculated the objects' volumes, applying the same principle utilised by Archimedes in his historic effort to measure the volume of a crown and ascertain its purity.

This practical activity provided students with a deeper understanding of Archimedes' principle and its significance in scientific inquiry, whilst enhancing their measurement and analytical skills.

Year 13 Biology Students Demonstrate Precision in Capture-Mark-Recapture Methodology

The Year 13 Biology cohort recently undertook a practical exercise to study the capture-mark-recapture sampling technique—a method widely employed in ecological research to estimate population sizes. In this instance, Skittles were used as a representation of the population under investigation.

Students meticulously prepared their data tables in accordance with the OCR checklist, ensuring the completion of a key CPAC skill. Following the collection and recording of data, calculations were performed to estimate the total "population" of Skittles within each bag. The experiment yielded remarkably accurate results, with one group arriving within one Skittle of the actual count!

Sparx Reader is an online reading platform allowing students to regularly read books for pleasure. Everyday reading is not only a relaxing activity, but also allows students to expand their ideas, vocabulary and improve understanding of any text they will face in exams or as adults.

Sparx Reader offers students a choice of books at their reading level, as well as ensuring they read books with understanding by completing check-in questions along the way. The platform is used for KS3 English weekly homework; students need to achieve minimum 300 points each week (this equates to approximately 30 min of careful reading).

We are very pleased that many of our students exceed this target every week, with some top scorers achieving well above a thousand points a week. Since the launch of Sparx Reader a month ago, our KS3 students have completed amazing 4272 hours of careful reading and read altogether 1 books so far. Truly well done!
