# Key Messages

Dear Parents and Carers,


I am delighted to let you know that we have been busily preparing for our students to return to school and I have written to all our families today to explain the timetable for our staggered return to school.

A reminder that all secondary schools are being asked to offer students three lateral flow tests on site (leaving approximately 3-5 days between each test) from 8 March. Testing remains optional but 'strongly encouraged'. Students can return to learning on site once they have had one negative test (or been offered one test and declined). After students have had three tests onsite (or the offer of three tests), they will be provided with home testing kits to continue with twice weekly testing at home. Please click here to access the letter and the consent form and privacy form. I would like to reassure you that no student will be tested without the relevant consents.

I will wite to the parents/ carers of exam groups next week with further details of how grades will be awarded in summer 2020. In the meantime, you may read relevant information here and here from the media.

I would like to thank you so much for your kind donations of Icons for each of our classrooms and also for your generous contribution toward our STA book fund. We have received £225 from the recent Big Give campaign which added to previous donations from the Autumn term gives us a total sum of £678 from parental

donations. We will be using these funds to buy individual reading books for our students. Mr Martin will be in touch with more details soon.





During Geography, students were asked to use items in their house to creatively construct a representation of the earth's compositional layers. Amazing work students!


