Dear Parents and Carers,

Many thanks for your continued support as we head toward these vital remaining weeks of the summer term.

Year 10 and Year 12 have conducted themselves impeccably during the two week end-of-year examination period. Years 7, 8 and 9 end-of-year exams now follow. These examinations are vital for us to identify gaps in learning for our students so that we can plan to address these through targeted interventions and through resequencing of the curriculum.

However, I am pleased to inform you that we will continue with our planned visits to St Katherine's Greek Orthodox Church for Years 7, 8, 9 and 10; the Year 11 into sixth form bridging activities; the Year 6 after school lessons; the Year 6 transition day and the Year 5 transition activities. All of these activities will be risk assessed and will follow our COVID-safe protocol. We may need to modify our plans in the event of any local surges in infection rates and I will of course keep parents and carers updated.

Faith



On Sunday 20 June, the Orthodox Church marked Holy Pentecost.

After the Ascension of Christ, the disciples were eagerly awaiting the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem as was promised to them by Christ. They had no clue as to when this was going to happen. They didn't realiz what the impact of that moment was going to be and how it was going to affect them. Finally, ten days after the Ascension, the Holy Spirit descended. They were empowered and filled with wisdom and knowledge never known to them before. It is the Wisdom that can only come from the Grace of the Holy Spirit himself.

In Christ's Resurrection we receive the "New" Pascha (Passover), Christ passing over from death to life.

In much the same way, the descent of the Holy Spirit was connected to the Old Testament Pentecost (Shavu'ot). This period is counted from the second day of the Jewish Passover for seven weeks to equal the fiftieth day.

The fiftieth day is considered to be that of new beginnings. People of Jewish faith see this as a season to be redeemed spiritually from bondage to idolatry and immorality. Also, in ancient times, Jewish people would plant trees for each newborn child; a cedar for a boy, a cypress or pine for a girl.

With this background, one can see why the giving and descent of the Holy Spirit had to be on the fiftieth day after Pascha. Indeed, the new Pentecost transformed the old! In the old Pentecost we had the giving of the Law.

In the "New" Pentecost we have the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the giving of the Grace and Wisdom of God. It is no more God's Law but God's Grace which bestows His Wisdom that is being received — and we are continuously in the

process being filled with the Grace at every moment. It truly is "The New Beginning" and the beginning of "New Life."

Historically, it was also during this time period when many were baptized and were the newly enlightened ones (νεοφωτιστοι – neophotisty). It was the start of a "new" beginning for them. This is the reason Pentecost was referred to as Whitsuntide, because of all those who were baptized and who wore their white baptismal robes. It is referred to as "Wisdom Sunday," also, because the Holy Spirit is the "Wisdom of God" as mentioned before.

In the Ukraine Pentecost is also known as "Green Sunday" and in Poland as the 'Green Feast." The colour green symbolizes "New Life". Greenery and flowers are brought into the home and into the church. In some parts of Greece, it is customary to break off branches from walnut trees and/or flowers, and to place them on the floor of the church to kneel on during prayers. In Russia it is common to have flowers, green grass, or hay on the floor for the same purpose. The church is completely dressed and decorated in greenery. The vestments worn by priests and altar covers are all green. It is the celebration of the renewal of the earth.



Virtual Faraday Challenge- Reminder



Over the past decade train travel has become ever more popular. Stations like London Waterloo and London Victoria now handle more passengers than the UK's busiest airports. This growth brings with it an increase in waste and Network Rail are committed to working sustainably and minimising their impact on the environment.

Your challenge is to design one product which will help them to do this.

The brief is very broad. Your design could be something to help manage, re-use or recycle waste from stations or something to help reduce carbon emissions. It could be something which ensures clean air for passengers and local communities or something which helps encourage and protect wildlife alongside train tracks. You will need to do some research around the challenges Network Rail faces in waste management to help you choose the area you will focus on.

We don't want you to design a whole station or train route; we just want you to design a single product which might only be a tiny part of our stations or a small part of train track. The more innovative, the better.

You may have seen in the news this week that a recent Ofsted report has said that 90% of girls in schools and colleges say that sexist name calling is something that happens 'a lot or sometimes'. Part of this report said that children often don't report these instances because this is a seen as normal behaviour and is part of the experience of school.

It is not and should not be.

Our PSHCE and pastoral curriculum teaches students, in an age-appropriate manner, about matters such as consent and the dangers in sharing explicit images. We know that all our families will support us to help our students to understand what is right and what is fair. Should there be any sexist, or prejudicial comments of any kind, we want to know and we will follow this up immediately to support and challenge this with our students. We don't accept this behaviour in our school and we challenge the notion that 'banter' should be part of school life. Please do speak with your child if they are experiencing any of these issues and then please report this to us by contacting your child's Form Tutor or Head of Year.


