### COVID update

Thank you for your support as we continue to follow our COVID-safe risk assessment in school. This is proving very effective in keeping our school community safe and well as we enter the last week of term.

I would like to alert you to an important update about the new rules for daily testing.

From **Tuesday 14 December**, people who are fully vaccinated and identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take an NHS rapid lateral flow test every day for 7 days to help slow the spread of COVID-19. This aims to reduce pressures on people's everyday lives by replacing the requirement for Omicron contacts to isolate for 10 days, while protecting the public by identifying asymptomatic cases and stopping the chains of transmission.

A reminder that:

- Those who test positive or develop symptoms will need to self-isolate.
- Unvaccinated adults must continue to self-isolate for 10 days if they are a contact of someone with COVID-19.
- It follows a significant rise in Omicron cases in the UK with the new variant expected to become the dominant strain by mid-December.

### Faith - πίστις

#### The Time of Advent

Beginning in November, Orthodox Christians around the world begin to prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas. This time of preparation and fasting is 40 days long and leads right to the Feast of the Nativity. (It is the same length as Great Lent, which leads to Holy Week and Pascha; but there are different restrictions in each fast.)



This season of the Church year is called “Advent” by many Christians, as they focus on the coming of Lord. In **“The Year of Grace of the Lord,”**\* the author, a monk of the Eastern Church, writes, “One might perhaps feel that this term ‘coming’ is purely symbolic, for in fact Christ comes to us at all times, and even lives in us. Nevertheless, this approach and this presence of Christ, both of which are eternal, take on a special character at Advent-tide... A special grace of the ‘coming’ of the Lord is offered us. The Lord Jesus is already present to us; but the grace of Advent allows us a more vivid, and quite new, awareness of this presence.” (p45)

The monk continues the chapter on Advent by summarizing our prayers during this season with one word. The word that we pray during Advent-tide is “Come!” When we pray the word sincerely, this one-word plea fills us with hope, and we anticipate the Lord’s coming with greater fervour. As the weeks of Advent-tide pass, God willing, each day that we pray, we pray more purely. The author continues, **“Our prayer at Advent, ‘Come’, could... be interpreted thus: ‘Oh, let me be aware of Thy presence in me --- May the whole world feel Thy presence.’”** (p46)

Our focus during Advent is on the light which will be shining forth. Just as the days begin to lengthen after Christmas, the darkness in our hearts will be enlightened by the Son which Christmas brings into the world. After all, He is the Light of the World!

This year, during the Nativity fast, may we continually pray, “Come!” and prepare our hearts - and the hearts of our students - to receive the light that shines forth in Christ!

***Make ready, O Bethlehem: let the manger be prepared, let the cave show its welcome. The truth has come, the shadow has passed away; born of a Virgin, God has appeared to men, formed as we are and making godlike the garment He has put on. Therefore Adam is renewed with Eve, and they call out: ‘Thy good pleasure has appeared on earth to save our kind.’***

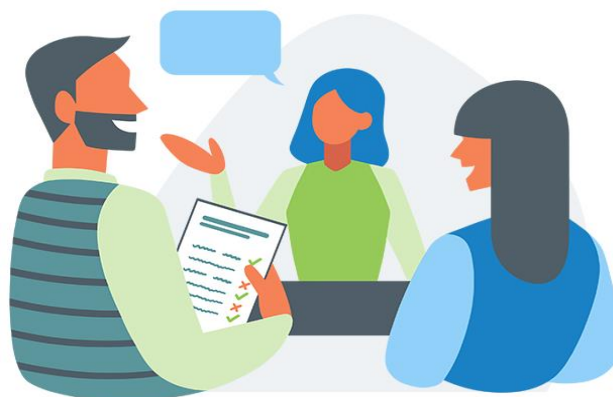

## Headteacher Parent Surgery

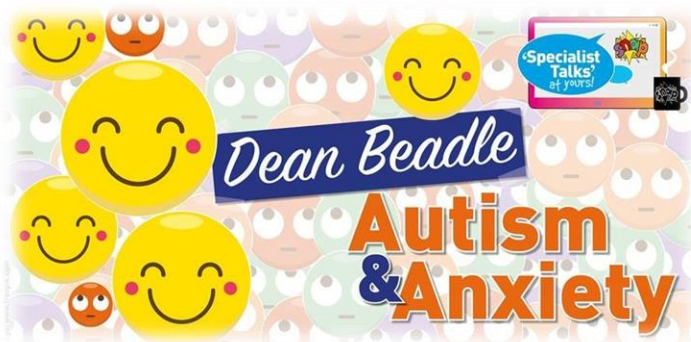

## Autism and Anxiety Talk – Dean Beadle



Dean Beadle has toured the UK for over fourteen years sharing his experiences of being autistic. He has also delivered keynotes in Ireland, Denmark, Belgium and Germany as well as undertaking four seminar tours of Australia and New Zealand. Through his humorous and insightful speeches, Dean outlines his positive outlook on being autistic, and challenges negative public attitudes. In 2011 Dean's work was brought to a wider audience, as a clip of one of his speeches was viewed globally on YouTube.

Ella received a late autism diagnosis after two of her children were diagnosed with autism. She also has a diagnosis of ADHD. Since her diagnosis she's been learning about autism, and the best ways to live for her neurology. She has a popular YouTube channel, TikTok and Instagram where she makes content for autistic people and the people who love and care for them, with the aim of encouraging neurodivergent people to live confident and happy lives.

## My Say Matters- message to Parents and Carers



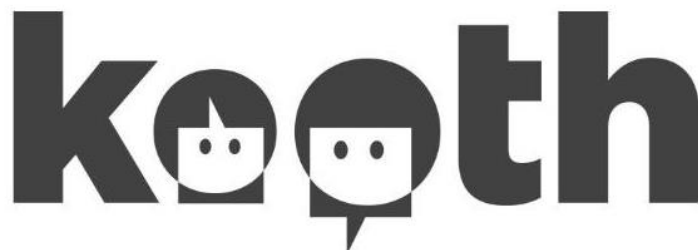

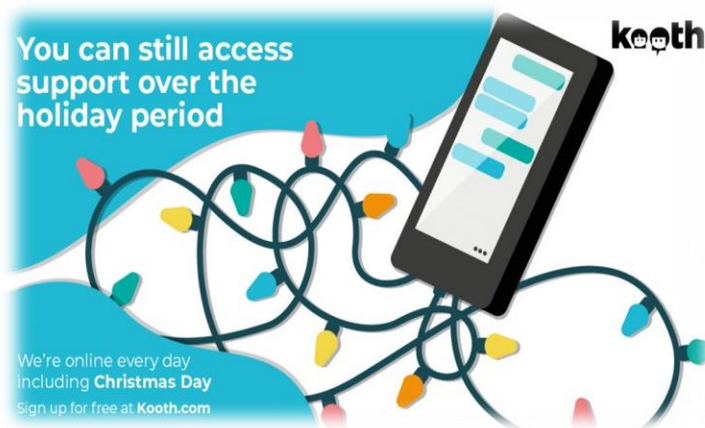

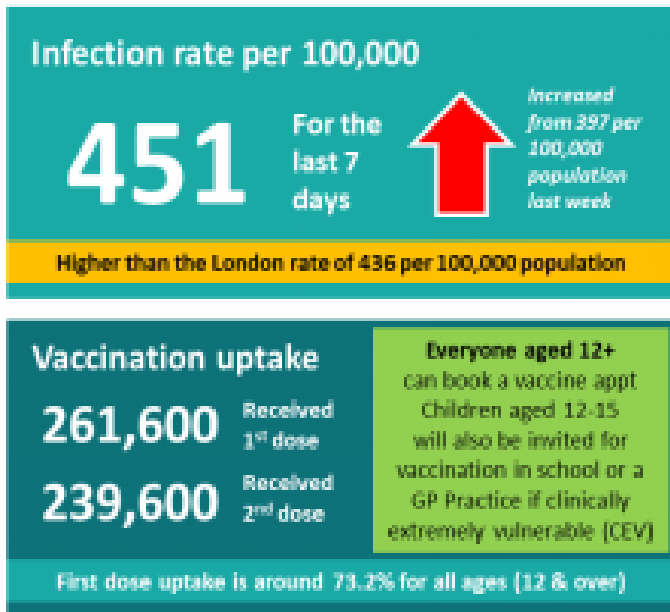

**Face coverings:** Face coverings should be worn in communal areas in all settings by staff, visitors and pupils or students in year 7 and above, unless they are exempt. Pupils or students (in year 7 or above) should continue to wear face coverings on public and dedicated school transport, unless they are exempt.

**Testing:** All educational and childcare settings should continue to encourage staff and students to test twice weekly using lateral flow device (LFD) tests.

**Contact tracing and isolation:** The current guidance on contact tracing and isolation remains in place. In addition to these, any suspected or confirmed close contacts of the Omicron variant will be asked to isolate for 10 days regardless of vaccination status or age. You will be contacted directly and told to isolate.

**Vaccination:** All eligible staff and students aged 12 and over are encouraged to take up the offer of the vaccine, including boosters. Vaccines are our best defence against COVID-19. They help protect young people and adults, and benefit those around them. Vaccination makes people less likely to catch the virus and less likely to pass it on. **Travel restriction update: Changes to pre-departure testing from 4am, Tuesday 7 December 2021**

From 4am, Tuesday 7 December all people aged 12 years and over must take a PCR or LFD COVID-19 test before they travel to England from abroad.

You must take the test within the 2 days before you travel to England.

This will apply whether you qualify as fully vaccinated or not. Some people, including children aged 11 and under are [exempt from taking the test](#).
