

Uniform



Full details of our uniform can be found on the website. Please be mindful of the following:

Jewellery: A watch, a medic alert bracelet if required and a small pair of studs – one in each ear only.

Hooded Tops: These are banned items and must not be worn to school. School jumpers should be worn over PE kits

Shoes should have a distinct heel for boys – images of appropriate footwear can be found on the website. Please check this before buying new shoes.

Make-up: No make up, including nail varnish should be worn. Any make-up will need to be removed in school.

Skirts: Must be knee length. Please do not have the skirts tailored shorter as they will grow out of them very quickly.

Attendance & Punctuality



Attendance is a significant contributing factor in helping to secure positive outcomes for your child.

There are clear links between children achieving good GCSE results and their attendance to school.

- Our minimum target is 96% for all our students. Children who achieve this have an 83% chance of securing 5 or more 9-5 grades at GCSE.
- When attendance drops to 90%, the chance of achieving 5 or more 9-5 grades at GCSE drops to just 57%.
- When attendance drops to 88%, the chance of achieving 5 or more 9-5 grades at GCSE drops to just 1%.

Ensure your child starts their day positively by being here on time. Breakfast is available from 8.10am in the B5 canteen. They must be on site by 8.25am – practice runs over the summer will help to ensure this is achieved.



Mobile Phones



Mobile Phones are not allowed to be see, heard or used at any point during the school day.



They should be turned off and put away. If phones are seen by staff at any point, they will be confiscated and held in reception until the end of the day.

If confiscated for a second time, parents will need to collect the phone.

If you need to contact your child, please go through the office. Please support us by insisting that your children do the same and that they do not contact you from their phones during the school day.

Mobile Phones Continued



- As parents / carers you have the responsibility for monitoring your child's phone. Advice regarding how to keep your child safe online can be found on our website.
- Year 7 is an important time for your children as they become more independent. This is when they need our guidance the most regarding use of phones. We recommend the following
- Mobile phones should be charged in a different room from their bedroom.
- Agree to have an 'open phone policy'. Part of growing up is being responsible and proving that they can do this by sharing what they look at is a good way to build trust.
- Take time to go through the recommended ages for social media sites and the law regarding the misuse of phones and messages.
- Limiting / controlling access to devices. There has been a significant decline in the mental health and wellbeing of teenagers since the introduction of smart phones in 2010.
